

# Puni School Pick up

A reminder to all Parents and Caregivers...

Thank you to you all for being on time to pick up your children. Just a few things to remember about our pick up areas. There are 3 areas that you can pick your children up from at the end of the school day.



## Area One: Quick Pick Up



This is the drive through area where the children are released from their classrooms and they go straight to the concrete area in front of the office. The children are checked off a list and put into your car. You will need to sign up for this at the office please.

## Area Two: Back pick up - AKA AKA ROAD



If you park in the back car park (AKA AKA ROAD) please wait on the deck by the tables where Maunga eat their lunch.

### Bus Children:

The children meet on Maunga's deck where the children sit on the picnic chairs or on the deck and Mrs Wallis checks the children off the bus list and they get on the bus to journey home.

## Area Three: Turf Pick Up



If you park in the front car park (Waiuku Road) to pick up your children please go directly to the turf area and your children will meet you there. It is a large space so please wait on the turf if you arrive before 2.30pm. This is a very busy area and the after school vans park here so to keep everyone safe do not wait in Te Awa's lunch eating area or by the gate of the turf but on the turf itself please.

## Things to Remember..

- ★ School finishes at 2.30pm and if you arrive before this and wait outside the children's classroom it disturbs the handing out of notices and reminders for the next day. If you are wanting to talk to other parents and do this outside the classrooms the children can hear everything that you are saying and we would appreciate if you could discuss adult matters away from these areas.
- ★ Te Puna and Waikato will be exiting down the ramp on the turf side., Waimana children will be going down their ramp and directly to their pick up areas.
- ★ At the end of day students need to focus on collecting all their own belongs, getting last messages, newsletters, book bags etc. It is important that they do this as part of learning to be independent.

We are always looking at ways to improve and streamline our pick up areas. The safety of the children is always forefront in our minds, remember to use the pedestrian crossing at all times - it is great practice for when they are out in the community!



Before school it is great to see parents and whanau especially as it is a good time to say hello and touch base with the teacher. If you have a more specific need or query it is often good to make an appointment. We do ask that the students are ready for learning by 8:25am so they can start with the teacher from 8:30am.
